

2019 INFORMATION SHEET

THE CAPITAL CHEMIST COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Capital Chemist College Scholarships are for ACT public school students who will be in their final year of secondary education in 2019.

Each of the ACT's nine secondary colleges and two specialist schools will be awarded up to three scholarships, including an Academic Excellence Scholarship, a Citizenship Scholarship and a Capital Chemist Scholarship to be offered to a student with a particular need.

Each scholar will receive \$1000 to be used for their direct educational benefit during their final year of schooling. Funds are to be administered by the student's School Principal, on the scholar's behalf.

The scholarship is to cover educational expenses such as:

- Face-To-Face Tutoring or Online Tutoring
- Uniforms and equipment
- Stationery and books
- Laptop
- Excursions and camps

If a student leaves public school before the end of Year 12, the scholarship will lapse. Any unspent monies at the end of the scholarship period must be refunded to the Public Education Foundation scholarship fund.

BASIC ELIGIBILITY

- Attends one of the following ACT secondary colleges; Canberra College, Dickson College, Erindale
 College, Gungahlin College, Hawker College, Lake Tuggeranong College, University of Canberra Senior
 Secondary College, Melba Copland Secondary College, Narrabundah College, The Woden School and
 Black Mountain School.
- Currently in Year 11
- Australian citizen or permanent resident

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Potential to do well at school and be able to demonstrate that the scholarship will make a significant contribution to reaching that potential
- Have a positive attitude towards school and high rates of attendance
- Intention to complete their HSC and continue to tertiary education
- Have clear future career goals
- Demonstrate they participate in school life
- Demonstrate they contribute in the community and/or in extracurricular activities



SELECTION PROCESS

A selection panel will review all scholarship applications and assess them against the selection criteria. The selection panel will include representatives of the Public Education Foundation and Capital Chemist College Scholarships Committee. After considering all applications, the selection panel will recommend the selected applicants for the approval of the Public Education Foundation's Board.

Applicants will be notified of the outcome via email. If successful, the scholarship recipient's school principal will also receive notification directly.

How To Apply

To apply for the Capital Chemist College Scholarship, students can access the link to the online portal via the Foundation's website – http://www.publiceducationfoundation.org.au/scholarships

Applicants may apply for one or more of the following Scholarships:

- Academic Excellence Scholarship the student demonstrates an outstanding record of achievement in schooling or has shown particular improvement or commitment to their studies.
- **Citizenship Scholarship** the student demonstrates a strong record of participation in community activities at school or in the community.
- Capital Chemist Scholarship the student demonstrates potential or ability in a particular area or skill which the school supports or wants to foster

Please ensure you indicate which scholarship/s you are applying for on your Application Form. You may apply for more than one scholarship category however no scholar will be awarded more than one scholarship.

Prior to starting your application, you should compile the following information ready to submit:

- Applicant details including:
 - o full name
 - o gender
 - o date of birth
 - o phone number
 - address
 - o email
- Residence status
- Parent/guardian details (at least one but up to two)
 - o name
 - o phone number
 - o relationship to student
 - o email address
- School details:
 - o name of school
 - address
 - o principal name
 - o email



- School Point of Contact the person at the school who you would like correspondence sent to name, phone number and email
- Basic information about you / your family:
 - o highest education qualification of your immediate family
 - o whether you are Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, or Pacific or South Sea Islander
 - o if you are from a Non-English-Speaking Background
 - country of origin of your parents and yourself
 - o which languages you speak and are spoken at home
 - o whether you have been in out-of-home care
 - o socio-economic background
 - how you found out about the scholarship
- Which of the three scholarship categories you are applying for
- A recent photograph of yourself (head shot)
- A statement outlining why you, the applicant, is a suitable candidate for this scholarship and how you meet each of the selection criteria. Please also outline your academic plan (Maximum 400 words)
- A copy of all pages of your most recent school report ready to upload
- A personal reference (PDF or Word format, maximum 400 words)
- A supporting statement from your Principal (PDF or Word format, maximum 400 words)

Note for Principals: Please be aware that your statement is a critical component of the application form and your feedback is given considerable weight in the process of panel deliberations. The panels are looking for feedback that goes well beyond simple confirmation that the student is enrolled in your school, or that you endorse the application.

SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

Once you have finalized your application and all elements are complete (including references as required) you can submit it for review.

Applications must be submitted by 11.59pm on Tuesday 30 October 2018.
